- "one of Britain's greatest poets and innovators for the contemporary stage".
- Her four earliest plays, *Downstairs* (produced 1958), *You've No Need to be Frightened*, *Having a Wonderful Time* (1960), and *Easy Death* (produced 1962) were performed at Oxford by student theatre ensembles.
- In her early work Churchill explored gender and sexuality through modernist theatre techniques of Epic theatre. In the mid-1980s she started to incorporate dance-theatre in her writing.
- Her Love and Information, opened at the Royal Court Theatre in September 2012

Postmodern comedy

- Postmodern Theatre is based on the idea that there is no Grand Narrative or Ultimate
 Truth
- This process of deconstruction raises questions rather than attempting to supply answers.
- As a reaction against Modernism, Postmodern Theatre deconstructs the axioms of genre and style and has no rigid structure, style or genre

- Lighting

- Downstage: Stage lighting
 - Consistent front and top light
 - Range between cool and warm depending on the story being told/ time of day

- Mid/Upstage: Dance lighting
 - Heavy sidelight
- Costumes
 - Natural, modern clothing. Use actors closets as much as possible
- Sound
 - Ambient music that possible switches when we enter a new section
